Doveridge Neighbourhood Plan HOUSING NEEDS SURVEY

Explanation of terms:

- Affordable housing. Is housing (whether for rent or shared ownership) provided at a cost considered affordable in relation to incomes that are average or below average, or in relation to the price of general market housing.
- Housing need. A person who lives in unsuitable housing and would not be able to afford to rent or buy on the open market.
- **Tied accommodation.** This is accommodation which is linked to a job, such as warden at a sheltered scheme or a cottage for a farm worker.
- Renting a property from an individual or from a company. Private renting.
- Housing Association renting. Renting a property from a Housing Association that is a registered provider of accommodation (registered with the Homes and Communities Agency).
- **Subsidised ownership to an affordable level.** This is often shared ownership with a Housing Association where a proportion of a property is purchased and rent is paid on the remainder. It can also mean other schemes to reduce in perpetuity the open market value of a property.
- **Supported housing.** Accommodation where the occupier receives some sort of help to enable him or her to live safely. For example, people with learning difficulties and people who are vulnerable as a result of age or circumstances.
