		Recommendations	Each recommendation were discussed and voted on. The following recommendations were agreed: On the basis that there are potential problems with all five proposed development sites, the Doveridge Parish Council consider that: o Two or three of the sites should be put forward for development. Only the amount of land required for the building of the number of houses	
			 should be put forward. Between 11 & 20 houses to be built. 20 - 25 % social housing is a more realistic proportion. That the Parish Council should represent the villagers to ensure the social housing is offered to villagers FIRST. We understand that High 	

Peak BC have a method of doing this.
 Any new housing should include a mix of lower priced starter houses for Doveridge youngsters.
o There should be a mix of housing both for the elderly & for the young.
o That the highly valued characteristics of the village, including a compatible housing style and the open landscaping should be retained.
 The National Planning Policy Framework says in Para 157. That Crucially, Local Plans should be based on co-operation with neighbouring authorities, public, voluntary and private sector organisations. We consider that for Doveridge, cooperation between Derbyshire Dales DC and East Staffordshire BC is vital.
 That the village benefits from extra amenities (including high speed broadband) as the result of the additional housing.
 At out village meeting no-one was in favour of building bunds or acoustic fencing to reduce road noise, as they are totally out of character with our rural village.
We rely on the DDDC to continue to protect our beautiful village.
